## Structure, Governance & Management

The Society has been a registered charity since 2003. The structure, governance and management are set out in its constitution agreed by the membership in 2003.

The objects of the charity are to;

- Make the character and achievements of John Hampden better known to the general public.
- Provide a library and archive of materials for research into Hampden's life and works.
- Preserve and conserve and erect monuments and artefacts associated with John Hampden.

Day-to-day responsibility for both restricted and unrestricted funds is delegated to the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer.

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Trust and of its surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

## Accounts

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985 and the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

As far as the Trustees are aware they have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant information.

## Funds

The charity currently has no restricted funds. The funds under its control can therefore be used to further any of the Society's objectives.

## Activities

The AGM was held at Broughton Castle on 14<sup>th</sup> April. Once again the Society is grateful to the generosity and hospitality of Lord and Lady Saye & Sele. The new membership subscription rates were discussed and agreed by members. These took effect on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013. This is the first increase in a decade. The meeting ended with a tour of the Castle and a talk by Dr Vivienne Larminie.

Members gathered in Aylesbury on 23<sup>rd</sup> June to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the unveiling of the statue of John Hampden in Aylesbury's Market Square. Wreaths were laid by Countess Howe of Penn and The Speaker of the House of Commons, Mr John Bercow MP. The Deputy Mayor of Aylesbury, Steve Patrick, was also in attendance.

Later, following a buffet lunch in the Gatehouse Room of the historic Kings Head inn, the two wreath layers gave short addresses to members and their guests. The Society was pleased to recall the links between Hampden and the Women's Tax resistance League and the part that they played in the original unveiling ceremony. At the start of the year the Society sponsored the Buckinghamshire Suffragettes Trail leaflet containing references to John Hampden.

The Society rounded off the year with a commemorative church service at Great Hampden on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> October. The address was given by lay reader Alan Machacek. Short speeches were made by the Earl of Buckinghamshire and the Chairman. Members then travelled the short distance to The Gate Inn at Bryant's Bottom for an excellent lunch.

The Society produced four editions of *The Patriot* quarterly newsletter. Thanks are due to The Editor, Anthea Coles, ably assisted by Roy Bailey and Derek Lester. Only two talks were given to outside bodies this year but both were judged to be successful. The Executive Committee is considering new ways of both promoting the talks and identifying new speakers.

Thanks are also due to Brian Cox, for consolidating the Society's stock of publications, weeding out obsolete items and making our publications better known to Booksellers.

The change in subscription rates, accompanied by a change in the Society's bankers and a refreshing of members' gift-aid declarations proved a significant administrative task. The Membership Secretary, Brian Cox, and the Treasurer, Derek Lester, are to be congratulated on the hard work that has gone into implementing these changes. Some members did end up paying twice and we are grateful for those who agreed to convert these into donations.

These changes and the problems experienced with the PayPal elements of the website have engendered much debate amongst members of the Executive Committee. Whilst the Committee is agreed that a new website is needed, detailed work is needed to specify the Society's essential requirements and to select a designer/provider. A new website will form an important part of the Society's drive to secure new members.
